Through a virtual physician visit qualified doctors can treat common injuries like sprains, strains, contusions, lacerations, pulled muscles, and more. But did you know that they can also handle injuries and illnesses previously thought to be only handled in person? Let's explore a few below:

- 1. **Needlesticks:** Accidental puncture wounds from used needles carry a high risk of bloodborne pathogen exposure. MedCall assesses the injury, creates a care plan, and guides the worker following their company's needlestick protocol.
- 2. Pathogen Exposure: We also treat bloodborne pathogen exposure beyond needlesticks, such as contaminated aerosol inhalation and accidental contact with blood, mucous membranes, or other infected fluids. If not immediately triaged, these exposures can put workers at risk.
- **3. Motor vehicle accidents:** In many industries we serve, vehicle accidents are the leading cause of injury. Our physicians quickly assess injuries, determine next steps, and provide reassurance in a stressful situation.
- **4. Lacerations:** As our fourth most common injury, lacerations are often easy to triage. Our photo tool helps physicians assess depth, length, and severity while a structured evaluation determines contamination risk and next steps.
- **5. Foreign body in eye:** A common injury, eye issues are quickly assessed for pain, redness, and tearing. Flushing may help, but embedded objects may require in-person care.
